2019 Core Focus - Health and Welfare

- Leading up to bargaining, we are focusing on Health and Welfare
- Core Issues for 2019-2020
 - Health Insurance
 - Vision and Dental
 - Paid Medical and Family Leaves
 - Mental Health
 - Child Care

Health Insurance

- The cost increase to the Student Health Insurance Plan that occurred over summer is abhorrent. It
 hurts students, who are already the most vulnerable group on this campus--not just GEO members,
 but all graduate students and all undergraduate students.
- The Organizing Committee is circulating a petition and planning additional actions in response to this--on behalf of all UMass Boston students.
- UMass Boston should increase transparency and communication to the process, and involve students in the process.
- Additionally, UMass has to recognize that the cost is too high for students to pay while living in Boston... and that students still deserve good health insurance.

Vision and Dental Insurance

- Optional program for all students
- Subsidies available for GEO members (up to \$150 for dental and \$92 for vision)
- Enrollment is very complicated
 - It feels like the university is making it hard to enroll to avoid GAs from using the insurance. GEO fought for these benefits for over 15 years - now that we have them the university is hiding the sign-up links!

PAID FAMILY MEDICAL LEAVE (PFML)

- Massachusetts signed into law the Paid Family Medical Leave (PFML) Law. This bill places a 0.75%
 tax on all employees in Massachusetts to pay for family and medical leaves.
- Students, even state employees, are excluded from this program.
- We are currently bargaining in a coalition with over 20 other UMass Unions about how the
 University system provides this benefit
 - We think that since it is a benefit there should be ZERO cost to employees. UMass should pay the premiums not the employees! We should not be unfairly taxed for a benefit our employer should provide!
- Watch the Grad Advocate for various campaigns we are planning to promote the topic and convince the University that students get sick, have children, and care for families too - and that they need support!

Mental Health

- There is a Mental Health crisis on University campuses all over North America
- GEO's position is that all students deserve proper mental health support!
- Many of us are TAs who need training and processes to help our undergrad students who come to us for help.
 - As a fellow student, we are often the first staff member they ask for help.
- Support dogs at exam times and free massages in campus center is nice, but it is only superficial help. People on call in UHS are often busy and over-staffed.
- UMass needs to know that we need support to address this ongoing crisis ASAP!

Child Care

- Last round of bargaining, the university showed no interest in providing child care and family support for graduate workers.
- THIS IS UNACCEPTABLE.
- Now UMB has shut the daycare on campus and cancelled support for off-campus child care.
- We need to push and fight for this for all of our members.
- We are organizing a working group of students with children, please come talk to us about how you can get involved in the fight for childcare!

Bargaining

- Bargaining will begin this year. It's a long process AND we need your support!
- During our all member meeting this summer the message was clear:

WE NEED TO FOCUS ON IMPROVING STUDENT HEALTH AND WELFARE!

- But we are still working to improve the rights and working conditions for graduate workers
- We will be reaching out to develop a bargaining platform, watch for the survey after Halloween
- What's important to you? Let us know so we can represent you in bargaining.
- If you want to join the bargaining committee, let us know!

Previous Bargaining Success Stories

- Raises of over 50% since GEO started
- 2% raise this year and last year
- Vision and Dental insurance subsidies (~50% now but we are fighting for more this year)
- Protection from discrimination and sexual harassment
 - Previously the University tried to remove these protections
 - We fought back there is a culture of harassment in higher education that needs to be fixed not ignored!
- Creation of a Scholarly Support Fund managed by students for students
- We fought to make full time jobs 18 hours instead of 20
 - That's 10% less work for the same pay...it's like a raise AND time off work! A double win for us!

Enough is Enough! Convocation Action Oct 2

- The Enough is Enough Campaign: No More Cuts or Fee Hikes! For True Debt relief at UMB!
- Convocation Action: UMass invites speakers, donors, and the entire campus community to attend
 - One of the speakers this year is Boston's Mayor Marty Walsh.
- GEO WILL BE THERE. This is an opportunity to show UMass--and the city of Boston--that
 Graduate Workers are important to UMass Boston's urban mission
- JOIN GEO AND START THE SEMESTER STRONG.
